FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK

Dear Alumni

I greet you warmly on behalf of your old school. 2021, like 2020, has been a year to remember in education. For those of you who are in the tertiary study phase of your lives, it certainly has not been easy with restricted in-person contact, and online assessments. Schools such as ours which have been in the privileged position of being able to conduct mostly in-person teaching and learning this year have been very fortunate. For most of the year we have been able to run the school at 80% attendance (matrics have been in 100% of the time) and this has meant that we have been able to engage in curriculum recovery following the terrible disruptions of 2020. We are aware that many schools in our country have not had this same privilege, thus we do not take our advantage for granted.

On the extra-mural front we have had a year of stop-start sporting and cultural activities. It was only towards the latter part of the year that our sports programme was able to really take off with inter-school matches being allowed. Many young people remarked at how much they had missed the buzz of competitive sport. Likewise, we were able to host our first music concerts, and a live audience of parents and students watched the recorded inter-house play festival a few weeks ago. It was wonderful to have these events back again. Parents in particular have been very happy to be allowed back on campus to support their children and to participate in the life of the school.

We sadly bade farewell to two staff stalwarts during the course of the year. **Mrs Fadia Hassiem**, who served as Deputy Principal in charge of academics, had been at the school for just over 13 years, teaching English as well as managing the broad academic portfolio. We wish her well as she charts a new course in education. **Mrs Pam Broster** has been part of the "furniture" at Pinelands High for as long as any of us can remember (34 years!), as a much loved Maths teacher and, for the past 23 years, as the school's Academic Administrator. With most staff and many students having been vaccinated, and with our strict Covid protocols in place, we believe that our school environment is a relatively safe space. We look forward to building this spirit up in them next year, along with the deep values of our school, the intangibles which are absorbed through normal human interaction, through co-operation and competition, through role-modelling and challenge.

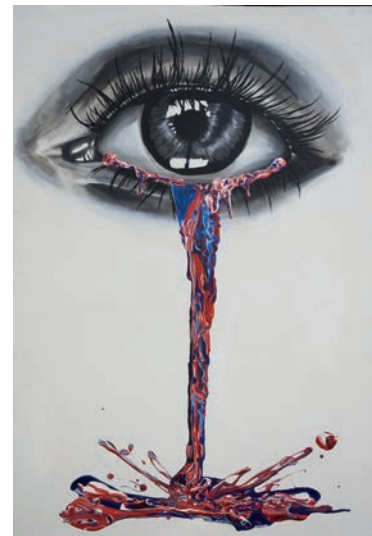
SHARED ACADEMIC SPACES
